Kerrville, TX – A non-denominational “Easter Sunrise Service” is being held at “*The Empty Cross*” on Sunday (3/31/13) at 7:00 AM, at The Coming King Sculpture Prayer Garden in Kerrville, TX. The one hour service, hosted by The Coming King Foundation, will be lead by Pastor James Wilson. Special music will be provided by Louada Raschke and her band. Communion will be available to all Christians.

On Good Friday before Easter (3/29/13) a special “Proclamation, Petition and Prayer Service” will be held at 7:00 PM and led by TCKF Trustee, Mims Johnston.

On Saturday (3/30/13) father and son, Bob and Jimmy Burnside will give three 30 minute presentations on the Tabernacle, at 11:00 AM, 2:00 PM and 4:00 PM. Live worship music and Christian testimonies will be shared in between their presentations.

Since parking at the top of the mountain is limited, drivers are asked to drop off their passengers at the top and then circle back around to find a parking place at a lower level. Guests should also bring flashlights, cameras, lawn chairs and wear suitable outdoor clothing.

The Coming King Sculpture Prayer Garden, located at 520 Benson Dr. in Kerrville, TX, is open year-round from 6:00 AM until midnight, and is free to the public. Currently, seven monumental Christian sculptures worth 2.25 million dollars have already been installed and donated to the garden by three international collected sculptors: Beverly Paddleford of Lander, WY, David Broussard of Dallas, TX and Max Greiner, Jr. of Kerrville, TX.

The 77’7” contemporary sculpture, “*The Empty Cross*” is believed to be the most symbolic cross in the world. Visitors have come from across America and other countries to see the blood colored, Cor-ten steel cross, which has already touched millions of lives. Pilgrims have come to see the unique cross from countries such as England, Nigeria, Mexico, France, China, Finland, Uganda, New Zealand, the Bahamas and the Philippines to experience the presence of God on the Texas Hill Country mountain.

The 70 ton sculpture, located at the same latitude as Israel, has been the subject of numerous state and national news stories because of the controversy and miracles associated with the massive open cross. Hundreds of photos have been taken of strange light phenomenon which are believed to be the angelic beings mentioned in the Bible (Ezk 1:15). Numerous physical healings have also been claimed, in addition to reports of God’s visible glory manifesting. Sparking dust appears out of thin air on thousands of garden guests. The glitter-like unknown substance, which has been examined by Texas A&M University, is believed to be the Shekinah Glory of God (Ex 34:29 & Isa 60:1).

After many years of effort, the impressive open cross sculpture was erected in July of 2010 on a 1,930’ hill overlooking IH-10 and the City of Kerrville. The cross is quickly becoming a national landmark and has been the subject of numerous radio, TV, magazine and newspaper stories across the USA and world. Even though the 23 acre garden is not finished yet, 100 to 300 people per day visit, making it the most popular year-round tourist attraction in Kerrville. For more information contact: **TCKF, P.O.
